Depression After TBI

YPSILANTI, Mich. Dec. 29, 2008 — Depression is a condition that can affect anyone, but it is even more prevalent in the traumatic brain injury (TBI) population. According to Webmd.com, an estimated 19 million adult Americans suffer from major depression. In the TBI community, more than 50 percent of stroke and brain injury survivors encounter depression in some stage after injury.

Is Depression After TBI Different?

Why do so many in the TBI community experience depression? Depression after a TBI is not just a painful and emotional experience, it also compounds many of the challenges that individuals with TBI typically face after injury.

Causes of depression after TBI appear to be more than just psychological factors. Multiple risk factors have been identified for post-TBI depression over the last decade, including substance abuse, perceived high levels of stress and those with slowing cognitive abilities.
